



# 8 Roseville girls receive Premier's Awards

Roseville College placed 36<sup>th</sup> in the State  
in the merit list of top schools

We congratulate our 88 girls from the Class of 2004 on their remarkable results. In particular, we recognise the achievements of the eight Roseville girls who received a prestigious Premier's Award for achieving Band 6, representing a mark of 90 or above, in at least 10 units: Courtney Allely, Karen-Anne Coleman, Sarah Colenbrander, Alexandra Ellinson, Jacqueline Kerr, Heike Lautenschlager, Abbie Lawrie and Stephanie Pow.

## Roseville girls *EXCEL*

Our girls have achieved excellent results across a range of subjects,  
although the intake of girls to Roseville College is non-selective.

- 8% attained a UAI of over 99
- 13% attained a UAI of over 98
- 40% attained a UAI of over 90
- 68% attained a UAI of over 80

- 52% achieved Band 5 or 6 in at least 10 units.
- 86% of Year 12 applicants received first-round offers in a University course of their choice.
- Roseville girls achieved 124 mentions in the Board of Studies Distinguished Achievers' List of students who were placed in the highest Band, Band 6, representing a mark of over 90 in individual subjects.

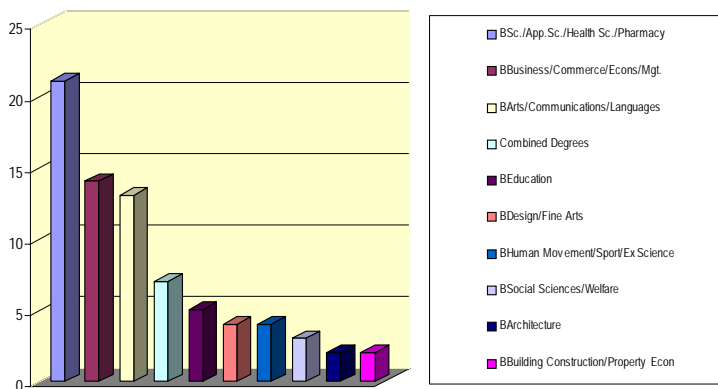

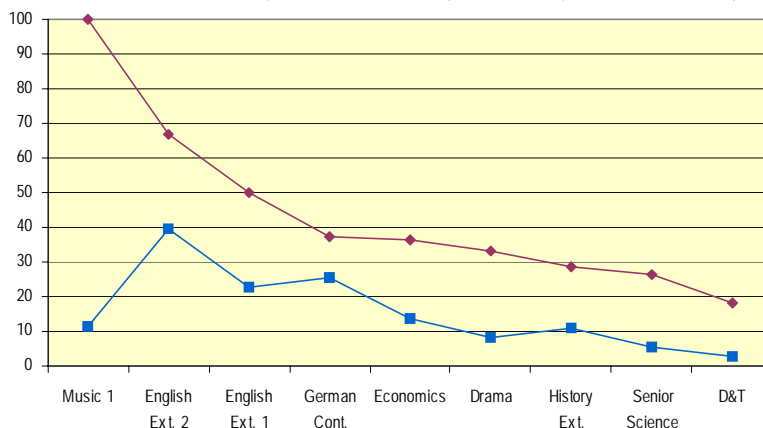
University courses chosen by Roseville girls in 2005
