ROSEVILLE COLLEGE PLACED 55TH IN THE STATE IN THE MERIT LIST OF TOP SCHOOLS

- 2% attained a UAI over 99
- 10% attained a UAI over 95
- 31% attained a UAI over 90
- 36% attained a UAI over 88
- 45% attained a UAI over 85
- 52% attained a UAI over 80
- 32% achieved a Band 5 or 6 in at least 10 units
- 81% of Year 12 applicants received first-round offers in a University course of their choice - this represents 2.5 times the state average. 90% of students were eligible for an offer
- Roseville College girls received 87 mentions in the Board of Studies Distinguished Achievers' List of students who were placed in the highest Band, Band 6, representing a mark of 90 or above in individual subjects

Recipient of a Premier's Award.

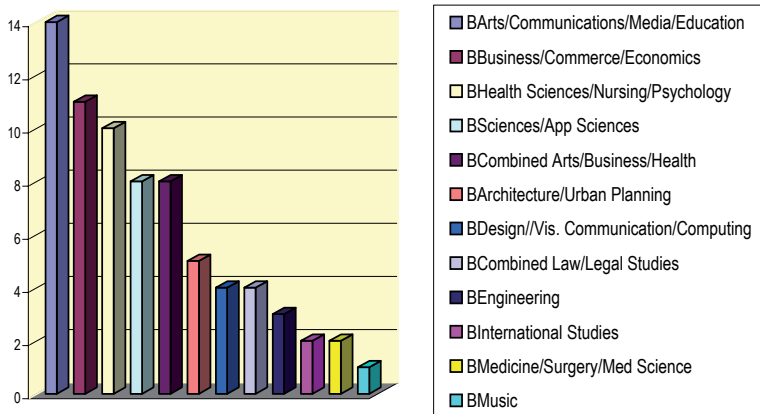
Louise has chosen to study for a Bachelor of Commerce degree at the University of Sydney.

University courses chosen by Roseville Students in 2006



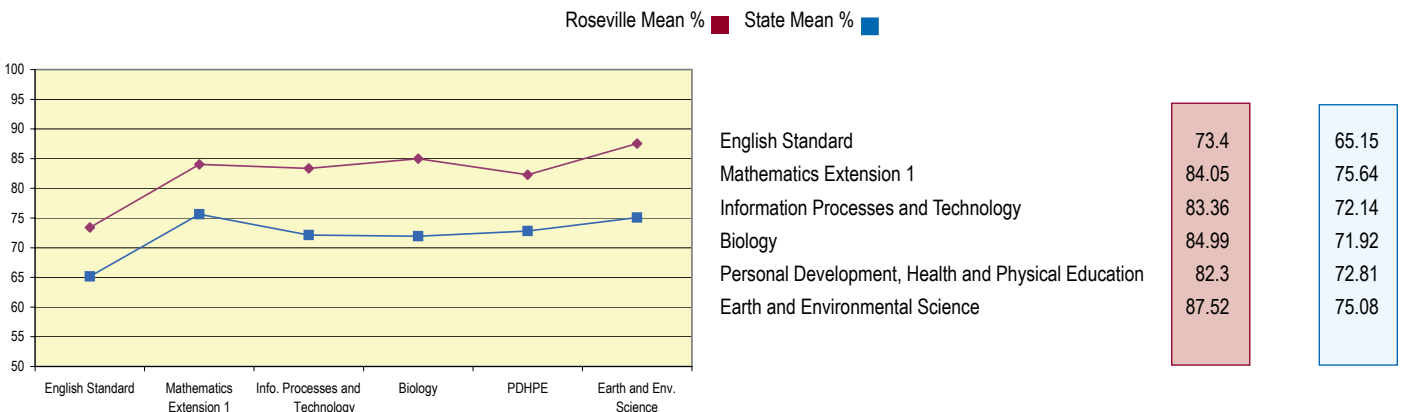
