

2010 HSC Results

We congratulate the class of 2010. Roseville College had a cohort of 88 students who received their Higher School Certificate and **almost one quarter of its students achieved an ATAR of 95 or over**. Approximately 40% achieved an ATAR over 90, 67% achieved an ATAR over 85 and over 80% of our students gained an ATAR of 80 or more. Roseville College is a completely non-selective school, and these results are a wonderful reflection of the girls' hard work and determination.

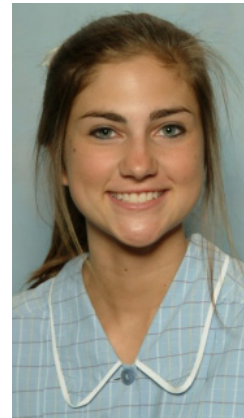
Roseville College received 150 Distinguished Achievements for results of 90 or over in a given subject.

Lisa Townsend – ATAR 99.40



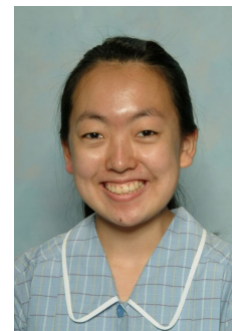
Lisa has been awarded the AAA Scholarship from the University of New South Wales and will be studying for a Bachelor of Combined Laws.
