


Re-developed gateway opens

The refreshed campus gateway from Bancroft Avenue opened on Monday 11 November.

The gateway is Stage 1 of completed CDC works, which were required to accommodate new underground sprinkler and water storage tanks (where the old pool used to be) on school grounds. All CDC work, including a new amphitheater and landscaping, are scheduled for completion by the end of the 2024 school year. W

Post-construction Parking Changes (Bus Zones, Kiss & Ride)


Ku-ring-gai Council changed parking on Bancroft Avenue, adjacent to Roseville College, from 4 November.

The 'Bus Zone' has increased to allow parking for two school buses, reducing obstructions to traffic in Bancroft Avenue and Glencroft Road.

The 'Kiss & Ride Area' allows two additional vehicles to drop-off or pick-up students at the College, and has been relocated eastward on Bancroft Avenue, away from the Glencroft intersection.

To faciliate peak times for pedestrians and road users in Bancroft Avenue, the College provides staff supervision at pedestrian crossings as students are dismissed and has increased visibility of Kiss & Ride Areas with Council-approved signage. The School will continue to work with Council in this area. W

Community communication in 2025

Once construction finishes, communication from the College will change. Here's what to expect:

Continued access to Project website and QR code (Conditions B8 and E4)

Maintained at <u>bit.ly/RC_SWELLCentre</u> for a minimum of 12-months, and updated as required. The QR code (on the back cover) still links to archived Community Updates (work notices, bulletins and special notices).

No more monthly construction works notices or project bulletins (Condition B8)

Construction-stage notices and bulletins to residents within 300m of the site will cease. Past notices and bulletins will be maintained at the website (see above).

A quarterly Neighbour Update and planned neighbour drop-in opportunities (Condition E4)

A Neighbour Update will replace the project bulletin and be delivered to 100 households nearest to the College at regular intervals. Neighbours are also invited to meet with the Director of Business Services on the second Tuesday each term at Main Reception, from 4.30 - 5.30pm, to raise issues or provide feedback. Planned dates are: 11 February (Term 1), 6 May (Term 2), 29 July (Term 3), and 21 October (Term 4).

Continued complaints mechanism and register (Condition A28, B8 and E4)

Neighbours can contact the Director of Business Services on (02) 9884 1100 to discuss operation of the new facility or other local issues. The online complaints form (under 'Construction Contacts' at our project website) will remain active and monthly registers will be published per condition A28 under 'Project details'. Emails sent to construction@roseville.nsw.edu.au will continue to be monitored for the next 12-months. W

Taylor's Construction Learning Partnership proves a success

Responding to a real industry issue, Year 9 and 10 students were tasked with a design thinking project to attract and retain women in construction.

100% of girls surveyed before the project said they would not work in construction and 70.6% reported a negative perception of the sector. Over five weeks, students participated in workshops, site tours and interviews with industry professionals before presenting their projects to executives at Taylor's head office.

The initiative successfully shifted student mindsets with a post-participation survey reporting 100% positive perceptions of construction – in fact, 58.9% are now interested in career pathways in the industry. (The NSW Government targets 15% female representation in the sector by 2030.)

Restricted hours for rock-breaking and similar work: 9am – 12pm and 2 – 5pm, Monday to Friday, and 9am – 12pm on Saturday.

No work on Sundays or public holidays outside special or emergency consent.
