Upcoming Works

- Concrete pours to Level 3 (pour 1), Level 2 (progress pour 2), Level 1 (high and low level pours 2), pool walls and lift-shaft.
- Commence install of bird cage in pool hall.
- · Installation of tanks in southeast corner.
- Completion of inground services to amenities area.
- Formwork, reinforcement and pouring of southwest amenities slab.

Completed Works

- · Level 2 slab, pour 1 is complete.
- Level 3 slab, pour 1 is formed and prepped for concrete.
- The pool base has been poured.
- Pool walls are being formed and fixed.
- Mechanical duct to plenum is installed.
- · Substation inground works complete.
- JY breakthrough ramp has been prepped.

Visiting staff were awed at the pace of structural work (aided by favourable weather) since the first major concrete pour of the level 1 carpark slab on 20 June (pictured right, before and after). The level 2 carpark slab and pool base were completed by 14 July. Staff were impressed by the skill and ingenuity underpinning construction practices on site.

The project remains on schedule with major concrete pours to continue throughout August and September, weather permitting. W


Construction careers under the spotlight as the project progresses

Students in Years 10 - 12 joined Taylor Women Breaking Ground at a Career Exploration breakfast on 17 May to mark National Careers Week.

Taylor's Design Manager, Cassandra Zughbi, was joined by Floriane Trazic (Project Manager), Rebecca Dearing (Cadet), Jacklyn Wickham (Marketing Manager) and, not pictured, Dean Fondas (Project Director) for a panel discussion about career journeys, entry points into the sector, and positive changes in the industry.

Students appreciated the panelists' authenticity as they emphasised how construction sites, like any prospective workplaces, value attributes of diligence, effective time management, personal organisation, and strong communication and interpersonal skills.

The Construction Learning Partnership delivers highquality learning opportunities in collaboration with Taylor's *Women Breaking Ground* engagement program (TWIC). The aim is to provide girls with exposure to an industry that many may not have considered and that remains underrepresented by women, and to facilitate learning and networking opportunities with inspiring female professionals. **W**
