While these outcomes reflect diligence, persistence and intellectual effort, our pride rests just as firmly in your character: young women who have learned to persevere, to support one another, and to approach challenge with courage and grace.

As a proudly non-selective school, we encourage our students to revel in learning and embrace challenge, knowing that growth is often shaped through passionate curiosity. These results reflect long hours of learning, a willingness to receive feedback, and a commitment to doing your best — individually and together. They speak to learning that has been both rigorous and relational.

There is much to celebrate.

This year we are **ranked 19th** in NSW in the Sydney Morning Herald’s HSC school ranking, up six places from 2024.

Three students achieved an incredible ‘**perfect score**’ of 99.95 and share the title of 2025 HSC Dux - Sophie Firek, Chloe Haeun Park and Stacy Zhang.

Three **First in Course** results — Stacy Zhang in Biology & Chemistry, and Sophie Firek in Legal Studies.

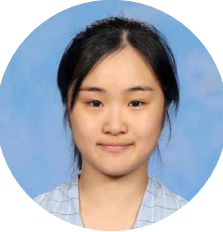
Next year, I hope to study psychology. I can't wait to see where everyone's path leads. Congratulations, Year 12 – we did it.
